



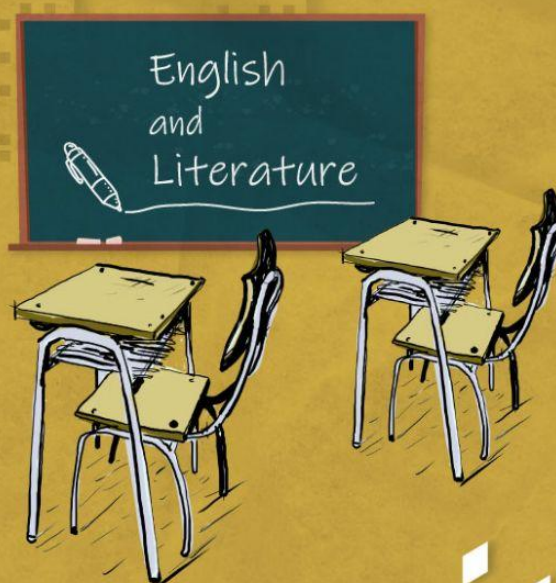

UNDER THE LENS

- con palabras que refieren a dos o más personas de manera conjunta; por ejemplo, padres (**parents**).

Además, en inglés, las palabras que nombran individuos en singular se diferencian por género (mujer o varón). Pero, cuando nos referimos a estos mismos individuos de manera conjunta, se utilizan otras palabras que incluyen a ambos géneros.
