step 1

Getting ready

We are going to set up a **Kindness Station** with activities to share with our classmates and other members of our school.



You will need:



- A4 sheets of paper,
 - coloured cardboard paper,
 - old magazines,
 - scissors,
 - glue,
 - paper,
 - coloured pencils or pens,
 - markers,
 - two small boxes.
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A. Read about kindness.

World Kindness Day is celebrated every year on November 13, and it is an opportunity to consider the most important and key principles of humanity.

To celebrate this day, we can do **small acts of kindness at home and at school** to bring people together.



Ready, set, get creative!

- A.** Make a big general poster to decorate the Station. Don't forget to include:
- the name of the activity: Kindness Station,
 - your school, grade and name of the students,
 - information about kindness (you can include some of the information from Step 1).
- B.** Make a kindness contract.
- Get together in groups and think of phrases and expressions we can use to: speak with respect, ask nicely, help others and apologise with grace.
 - Write the phrases in an A4 sheet of paper.
 - Put all the papers together to make a big poster under the title: Kindness Contract.
- C.** Work in groups on small acts of kindness.

Thankful notes:

- Prepare and decorate small cards to give thanks to the ones we love.



- Put the cards in a small box.
- Decorate the box and make a distinctive sign for this part of the station.

Acts of kindness chart:

- Make a poster with the acts of kindness chart.

- Get two dice for the station.
- Make small smiley faces or any other kind of stickers and put them in a box near the poster.





It 's Showtime!

A. It's time to do the activities in the classroom.

Thankful notes:

- Choose one of the cards and think of someone you want to give thanks to. It can be your family, your friends, your teachers or your neighbours!
- Write a “Thank you note” for that special person.

Acts of kindness chart:

- Work with the copy of the chart.
- Throw the two dice, count and find the corresponding number in the chart.
- Read the act of kindness and think of a special moment to do it during the day. Remember this is not a competition, it is important to be aware of the importance and significance of your acts.
- When you do the act of kindness, choose one of the smiley faces, colour it and paste it next to the corresponding square.
- Repeat the steps five times.
- Comment on the experience with your classmates and teacher.

B. Now it is time to share the kindness experience with other people in your school.

- Set the kindness station somewhere in the school and place all the posters you have prepared. Don't forget to set the thankful notes box and the big act of kindness chart poster with the two dice.
- During the break or at the beginning of the day, invite other people (students, teachers, etc.) to write a thankful note or to throw the dice to do an act of kindness.
