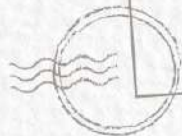


Dear children,

Life in the Cold

The Inuit, an Interesting People

The **Inuit** are native people of the Arctic regions. They live mainly in Alaska and Northern Canada. They do not usually live in igloos now but in log cabins. However, when they go fishing or hunting, they use igloos for shelter. They make holes in the ice to fish. They hunt animals for food and fur. They use animal skins to make warm clothes. It's freezing where they live!

Don't call them Eskimos.
It's offensive.

Inuit Crafts

In their free time, they carve ivory and bone to make beautiful pieces.

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All About Bees



Not All Are Social Bees

Bees live all over the world, except Antarctica. Most bees live alone. Some, like honey bees, live in organized groups called "colonies". They make their hives out of wax.

Did you know?

Male bees can't sting.
Only females have a stinger.

The Super Powers of Bees

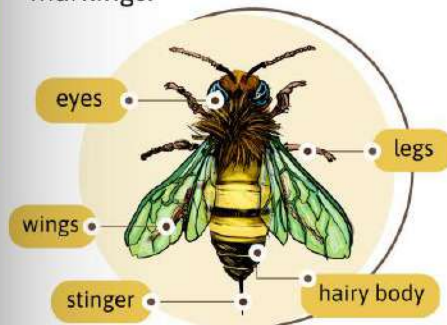
- Bees can communicate through "dances". They show each other where food is.
- They have a great memory. They can remember where flowers are.
- They can recognize human faces.

Interesting Facts

- They are important pollinators because they carry pollen in their legs and move it between flowers.
- 50,000 bees can live in a hive.

So Many Wings, So Many Eyes

Their bodies are small and hairy. They have six legs, two pairs of wings and five eyes. Most bees are black with yellow or brown markings.

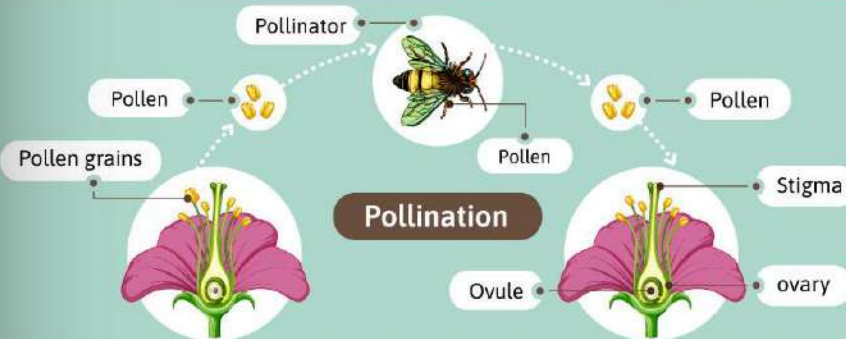

Bees get all their food from plants. They eat the nectar and pollen in flowers. That is why they like gardens and woodlands.



Amazonia: The Lungs of the Earth

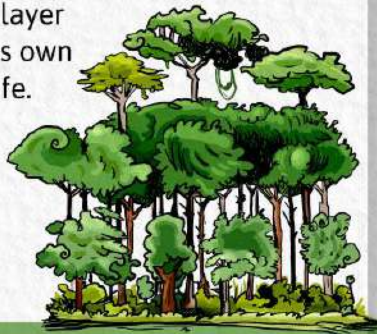
Home to Animals and Plants

The Amazon region is the area around the Amazon River, the largest river in the world. It has a rich ecosystem with many animal and plant species. It is very warm and wet. It rains heavily almost every day.



Layers upon Layers

Plants and trees grow very fast in the forest. This has many layers: The bottom layer is the *understory*, the middle layer is the *main canopy*, and the top layer is the *emergent trees*. Each layer has its own wildlife.



Interesting Facts

- There are about 400 indigenous tribes in the Amazon forests.
- When there are floods, some children use school boats.

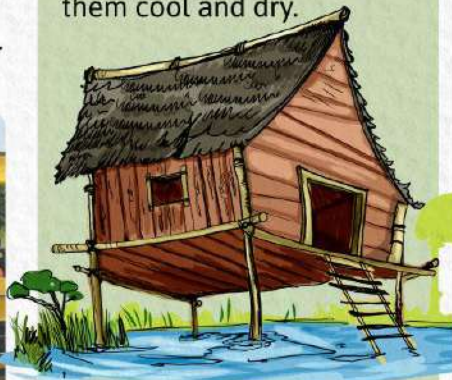


King of the Jungle

Jaguars are powerful felines that live in the jungle or near lakes, rivers and wetlands. They are big, beautiful cats with rounded heads and short legs. They are covered with dark spots, called rosettes. They have strong jaws and they hunt deer, capybaras, turtles and even caimans and snakes. They can swim very well.

Amazon Peoples

Some indigenous tribes do not have contact with other people at all and live deep inside the forest. Other groups live in villages near the river. They build their houses on stilts to keep them cool and dry.
